

How will my application be considered?

If you are a Year 12 student

Your application will usually be considered on the basis of your Universities Admission Index (UAI), or the equivalent interstate result. Some courses have additional selection criteria. UAI cut-offs for 2006 entry are listed on page 9 next to relevant degrees, faculty by faculty.

If you have a record of tertiary study at a university, TAFE or a private college

Your results from tertiary study may be considered in addition to your Year 12 result. For further information about what 'tertiary study' is, please contact the University of Sydney Admissions Office.



If you have a school or uni qualification from overseas

You should contact the University of Sydney Admissions Office to see whether your qualifications can be considered and if you must sit an English test. International students should contact the International Office for advice and an international student prospectus (see page 10 for details).

If you're 21 years or older and do not have any academic qualifications other than, perhaps, a non-competitive Year 12 result

You can apply to start a degree after you have completed a preparation course. For information about the requirements for mature-age entry please call the University of Sydney Special Admissions Office.

Other applicants

If you do not think you fit into any of these categories, contact the University of Sydney Admissions Office to find out how you can start a degree course.

Special entry

If you are concerned that your results may not be good enough to be accepted to uni, you may wish to find out more about the University's special entry schemes. Some of these are:

- > The Broadway Scheme – for educationally disadvantaged Year 12 applicants
- > Flexible entry – for Year 12 applicants whose UAIs fall just below course cut-offs
- > The Cadigal Scheme – for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander applicants
- > The Special Consideration for Admission Scheme – for applicants with a record of tertiary study
- > The Elite Athletes and Performers Scheme – for applicants whose results have been affected by their training commitments
- > Rural Students Entry Schemes – for pharmacy (rural) and physiotherapy courses
- > The Multicultural Entry Scheme – for applicants to certain health science courses
- > Vocational entry – for applicants to certain health science courses
