

Research internship opportunity

The University of Sydney Gambling Treatment and Research Clinic (GTRC) is pleased to present an internship program for early career researchers interested in learning about gambling and gaining research experience.

Placements are available each semester and over University semester breaks for early career researchers to work as part of the GTRC. Successful applicants will be supervised by GTRC researchers and be involved in various research projects related to minimising gambling harms within a supportive learning environment. This highly valuable experience would greatly enhance your track record and likely increase success in future applications for higher research degrees, scholarships and awards, and research funding. Our aim is to provide the most promising early career researchers with experience that would aid in developing an independent research career. The goal of the program is to increase the number of well-trained professionals who pursue careers in gambling research.

Eligibility and Conditions

Applicants must have a minimum of two-years towards an undergraduate degree in a subject relevant to gambling with an excellent academic record. Preference will be given to those who are studying psychology and who have completed a four-year undergraduate degree, including a significant independent research project and training in statistics. Applicants may be currently enrolled in a Masters or PhD program, or intending to enrol in a postgraduate program and seeking further research and clinical experience. The successful applicant must be based in Sydney for the duration of the placement. Interns must be available for a minimum of 14 hours a week, with at least one full day spent within the GTRC at the Brain and Mind Centre. We welcome applications from Australia or international candidates with a track record of high impact research, an accelerating research trajectory, and a commitment to advancing the gambling research field.

Preparing an Application

Applicants should submit a cover letter outlining why you would like to apply for the position, what you would bring to the role, your previous research experience and preferred timing, a CV and transcript of previous university courses.

Deadline

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis. However, a limited number of placements are available.
