## From paradise to prison: Palm Island

Thalia Anthony writes on legal issues and developments pertaining to Australian Indigenous people – especially stolen wages, sentencing and policy. In this talk for the *Being Collected* series at the Macleay Museum, she will talk on the enduring effects of Indigenous segregation to Palm Island since the 1920s. She points to the death in custody of Mulrunji as the culmination of a tense history of Indigenous policing.
