Les Murray is an honorary doctor six times over and a visiting professor at the University of Sydney (attached to the Macquarie Dictionary). But what he is really known for is writing poems, always varied and sometimes grim, often very entertaining. He will read samples of his poetry with explanations and anecdotes along the way, and will also answer queries at the end of the reading.

Judith Beveridge has published three books of poetry all of which have won major prizes. A fourth book, *Storm and Honey*, is due out in 2009 from Giramondo. She is currently the poetry editor for *Meanjin* and teaches Poetry Writing at Sydney University.

Stephen Edgar has published seven books of poetry, the most recent being *History of the Day* (Black Pepper, 2009). His book *Lost in the Foreground* won the Grace Leven Prize for Poetry in 2003. In 2005 he won the inaugural Australian Book Review Poetry Prize for his poem "Man on the Moon" and in 2006 he received the Philip Hodgins Memorial Medal.
