**Herbert Johnson Travel Grants
Conditions of Award**

Under the will of Herbert Johnson in 1937, the whole of his estate was bequeathed to his widow for life, and the income from certain portions to be paid to certain beneficiaries for their life, with the remainder upon their respective deaths to the Senate of the University. Mrs Johnson died in 1952 but was predeceased by two of the four successive life tenants, and accordingly half the estate was transferred to the University amounting to £5460.

In 1953 the Senate decided that this amount should be used to establish travel grants and that when the whole of the estate is available to the University further consideration will be given to the use of the fund.

Travel grants are awarded under the following conditions:

1. The income from the Herbert Johnson Fund is available for payment to graduates of the University of Sydney who proceed overseas to undertake research work and who are unable to meet their total costs from other funds.
2. Grants may be made to graduates where they hold travelling scholarships or other travel grants and shall be made for the purpose of travel to or from Australia or from one place of research to another while overseas or for expenses in connection with their work. The value of the award shall be determined by the committee.
3. Grants from the fund shall be made by the Academic Board on the recommendation of the committee appointed to consider travelling scholarship
