No application is required. At the time of the commencement of the Summer School unit(s), the student must be enrolled in, but not have completed, a postgraduate award course administered by the Faculty of Business and Economics at the University of Sydney. The student may be part-time or full-time, local or international.

SELECTION OF WINNER:

- i. A decision will be based on final results in Summer School units of study received by the Student Centre on or before March 16, 2007. No results received after this date will be considered.
- ii. The award will go to the student who achieves the highest mark in a 6 credit point postgraduate Summer School unit administered by the Faculty of Business and Economics, provided that their final mark is 85 or more.
- iii. In the event of a tied result, the award will be made to the student from the tied group who has completed, with a grade of pass or better, the highest number of Summer School credit points in that session.
- iv. If the result is still tied, the award shall be made to the student from the tied group with the best academic performance in their postgraduate award course. The Prize is awarded on the recommendation of the Dean of Business and Economics in conjunction with Summer School.

P1236	ECONOMICS AND BUSINESS SUMMER SCHOOL UNDERGRADUATE MERIT PRIZE	1
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To be awarded to an undergraduate Economics and Business or combined Commerce coursework student for excellent work in an Economics and Business unit of study in the Summer school (covering the period December, January and February).

TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR CONSIDERATION:

No application is required. At the time of the commencement of the Summer School unit(s), the student must be enrolled in, but not have completed, an undergraduate award course administered by the Faculty of Business and Economics at the University of Sydney (other combined Commerce coursework degrees not under the Faculty's administration will also be considered). The student may be part-time or full-time, local or international.

SELECTION OF WINNER:

- i. A decision will be based on final results in Summer School units of study received by the Student Centre on or before March 16, 2007. No results received after this date will be considered.
- ii. The award will go to the student who achieves the highest mark in a 6 credit point undergraduate Summer School unit administered by the Faculty of Business and Economics, provided that their final mark is 85 or more.
- iii. In the event of a tied result, the award will be made to the student from the tied group who has completed, with a grade of pass or better, the highest number of Summer School credit points in that session.
- iv. If the result is still tied, the award shall be made to the student from the tied group with the best academic performance in their undergraduate award course. The Prize is awarded on the recommendation of the Dean of Economics and Business in conjunction with Summer School.

P1238	Department of Employment and Workplace Relations Prize for Applied Econometrics	1
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The prize established in 2007 by an annual donation from the Department of Employment and Workplace Relations shall be titled Department of Employment and Workplace Relations Prize for Applied Econometrics. The objective of the prize is to encourage academic excellence in the study of Applied Econometrics. Awarded to the student with the highest mark overall in the unit of study, Applied Econometrics (ECMT 3120). Selection is based on coursework, examination results and the recommendation of the Chair of Discipline and/or the Unit of Study Coordinator. The recipient is ineligible if the award is based on results from a second or subsequent attempt in the nominated course of ECMT 3120 Applied Econometrics. If the unit ceases to be offered, the prize will be awarded for another course offered by the Faculty of Economics and Business - the content of which is determined by the Dean of the Faculty to be similar in content to the nominated course that has ceased to be offered.

The prize may be shared.
